Ball's Bluff Battlefield

Located in Potomac Park in Leesburg, features one of the smallest National Cemeteries: a burial place of the soldiers that died in the Battle of Ball's Bluff. The park also offers a one-mile hike.

Local Loudoun Trails

Raven Rocks

Time: 2 hours 57 minutes

Length: 5.7 miles

Terrain/Landmarks: A moderate trail with the final view being breathtaking. It is fairly steep with some ridges along the way, which some locals call a "roller coaster."



Time: 46 minutes

Length: 1.7 miles

Terrain/Landmarks: If you like bird watching, hiking, or running, this is the trail. Dogs are welcome and can be off the leash in some areas of the trail.

Chapman DeMary Trail

Time: 20 minutes

Length: 0.55 miles

Terrain/Landmarks: A great trail for a picnic, exploring the creek, and taking a nature walk. There are also a multitude of signs where you can discover new information about trees and wildlife. Go explore!



Time: 16 hours 22 minutes

Length: 44.5 miles

Terrain/Landmarks: A mostly flat trail, the Washington and Dominion trail is one favored by both experienced and average joggers and bikers. If you're looking for somewhere scenic but not too strenuous, a casual half-hour stroll along this trail is for you!
